

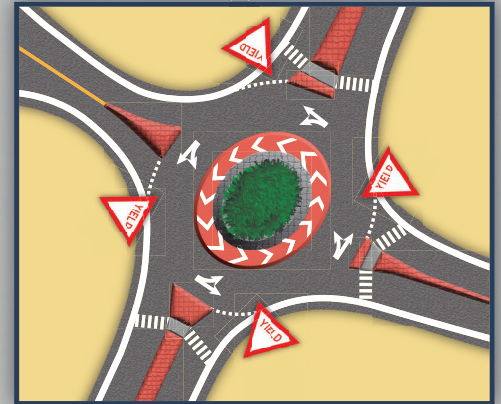

## Tips on Driving a Roundabout

### Rules of a Roundabout

- **SLOW DOWN AS YOU APPROACH.** Watch for pedestrians in the crosswalk.
- **YIELD TO TRAFFIC ALREADY IN THE ROUNDABOUT.** Look to your left. Traffic already in the roundabout has the right-of-way. If it's a double-lane roundabout yield to both lanes. The speed limit for a yield sign is 15 MPH.
- **ENTER THE ROUNDABOUT WHEN THERE IS A GAP.** You do not need to come to a full stop if you can safely enter without stopping. Keep going once you're in the roundabout. You don't yield to traffic that's entering.
- **USE YOUR TURN SIGNAL WHEN EXITING.** Alerting other drivers that you will be exiting helps keep traffic flowing. Yield to pedestrians in crosswalk while exiting.
- **DID YOU KNOW?** If an emergency vehicle enters behind you with its lights on, continue to your exit and pull over after you have exited the roundabout.



### PRO TIP: THE YIELD

When entering the roundabout, you only need to stop if there is not a safe gap in traffic. If you can enter the roundabout safely without causing a collision, you can keep moving through without stopping.

### POV: You're driving in a roundabout. What do you do?

Look to the left for oncoming traffic. They have the **RIGHT-OF-WAY**.



Always **YIELD** to traffic that's already in the roundabout.
